



Fly Yourself Around the World

Air Journey invites you to fly an extraordinary 25,000 nm trip visiting 27 countries

On May 11 this year, a group of airplanes will take off from the East Coast of the United States with a flight plan sure to grab the attention of almost every pilot — circumnavigating the globe.

The trip departs from Maine and heads across the Atlantic for stops in Greenland and Iceland before landing in Europe. As always with Air Journey “vacations,” guests will stay at the best hotels and resorts, and dine at many of the world’s finest restaurants. This escorted adventure around the globe also

will include a number of once-in-a-lifetime experiences, like a camel ride in Sharm el-Sheikh, Egypt, snow-skiing in Dubai and a candlelight dinner on the Great Wall of China. All in all, the trip takes in 38 destinations in 27 countries, crossing the West Coast of the United States 72 days later.

Despite the distances to be covered, Pouille always insists that the schedule allows for an abundance of time in each destination to relax, explore and drink in the total experience. There are planned group activities scheduled — a private cocktail party in a Parisian penthouse, a cruise down the Bosphorus Strait, elephant rides through the jungles of Chiang Mai, a visit to Angkor Wat in Cambodia and a tour of the Gyeongbokgung Palace in Seoul — along with free time for each member to enjoy the trip as he or she wishes, from scuba diving to shopping.
